

# THE FULTON PARK DRAWING

## Sixteen of the Purchasers Were Lucky Enough to Win Houses.

A Large Crowd Gathers in the Pavilion to Witness the Drawing, Which Was Conducted by Twelve Judges.

The drawing of lots in Fulton Park took place yesterday afternoon according to an announcement at the Mechanics' pavilion, in the presence of a large number of purchasers, among whom were quite a number of ladies. The affair was conducted strictly in accordance with the arrangements made by the company for that purpose, and no pains were spared to insure perfect fairness and correctness.

The first thing in order was the selection of twelve judges of the drawing. Following is a list of those elected: O. Jekness, Hon. M. C. George, John Corkish, J. A. McCully, Joe Waddell, E. G. Jones, J. Ganty, W. H. Ball, Mrs. S. Bullock, Miss Nora Simpson, Miss Carrie Nassau and Mrs. E. C. Sloan.

Hon. M. C. George was elected chairman, and Messrs. E. G. Jones and J. A. McCully clerks.

Mr. George A. Steel stated that there were 1001 pool lots in the park, of which 108 had been sold.

Then 1001 tickets were produced, 108 of which bore the names of the purchasers, and the remainder the name of the company, who of course took that many chances in the drawing. The names on the tickets were carefully compared with the list of purchasers and the whole counted and deposited in a patent revolving churn, which made a first class "wheel of fortune."

Then 1001 tickets were produced, each bearing the number of a lot and the block in which it is situated. These were carefully compared with the list of the pool lots in the park and counted and then deposited in a churn similar to the one in which the names had been deposited.

This work had occupied some time, and as the pavilion was uncomfortably cool the company adjourned to the superintendent's room, where there was a fire. Here the two churns were placed upon a table and Masters Frederick William Jones and Gilbert-Haven Pearce, being first blindfolded were placed beside them. The churns were revolved and then the covers removed and the boys bared their big right arms and proceeded to stir up the tickets in a thorough manner. The drawing then began. One boy would draw a name and the other a lot, each handing his ticket to the president, Hon. M. C. George, who read them, and then the two were inclosed in a rubber band and deposited in a box, the clerks noting the result. The drawing was slow work, occupying about three hours. The boys grew tired of standing and were furnished with seats and went on with their work.

Following is the report of the judges, showing the number and location of the lot drawn by each purchaser, those drawing houses being marked with a star:

As will be seen by the above the purchasers of lots drew more than their per centage of the houses. The 108 purchasers drew 16 houses, while their share of the 100 houses was less than 11.

A number of persons wished to know whether the company intended to continue the sale on the same terms.

The company do not intend to do so, as they consider their original proposition too liberal a one. They think it will be more profitable to build the houses and own them.

The manner in which the drawing was conducted was perfectly satisfactory to all concerned, as owing to the precautions taken there was no chance for the least suspicion of unfairness.
